What are apprenticeships?

- They are the oldest type of training.
- It's a job where you also gain a qualification.
- You spend most of your time working and learning on the job, and about 20% of your time in college/university/training centres.
- You get paid.
- You will leave with money, a qualification and lots of experience...
- However, often people continue to work at the place where they do their apprenticeship anyway!
- They are best known for being used in 'trades' but you can do apprenticeships in lots of industries and at lots of levels.





Why do you want to do an apprenticeship?

- I don't like the idea of university.
- I don't really know what I want to do.
- They're an easier option.
- I want to get paid.
- I don't want student debt.





Why do you want to do an apprenticeship?

- I have a definite career in mind.
- I am really driven to achieve my goals.
- I am prepared to handle rejection.
- I am willing to work much harder than my peers, and I'm happy to grow up much more quickly then them!





Is it worth deferring UCAS for a year?

- You'll still have a great application if you do decide to go to Uni?
- You have more thinking and searching time.
- You're less likely to make a rushed choice.
- UCAS applications are very similar to general job/apprenticeship applications.

Intermediate	2	5 GCSE passes at grade A*– C or 9 – 4
Advanced	3	2 A level passes/Level 3 Diploma/ International Baccalaureate
Higher	4, 5, 6 and 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 and 7	Bachelor's or master's degree

Sometimes it is possible to find your own employer! You can find an employer by doing the following:

- Ask friends and family if they know anybody who would take an apprentice on.
- Search for companies on the internet (including sites like indeed) and around York (big and small) whether they are looking for apprentices or not.
- Email, call, **visit** employers and ask if they have considered taking on an apprentice.

When you get in touch, use the following 3 questions:

- 1) Could I do an apprenticeship with you?
- 2) If not, could I work/have work experience with you?
- 3) Do you know anybody who might be able to help?

- Make sure you have an up to date CV to show potential employers.
- Try to get some work experience (and include this on your CV).
- If you need some help with your CV, ask Mr Daniel.

Straight to work:

If you plan to get a job (without an apprenticeship), make your you pick a job that has career progression for you! Make sure it is something that you are going to enjoy too!

Gap Years:

You can use a Gap Year to give yourself some thinking time, gain work experience, apply for apprenticeships or use it to gain some life experience.

If you are planning to work (part time or full time) in your gap year while your thinking about your next major step, get a job/volunteering that is relevant to your future plans (or possible future plans).

If you are interested in law, work for a law firm; if you're interested in hospitality and events; work in a restaurant etc.





Gap Years:

You can use a Gap Year to give yourself some thinking time, gain work experience, apply for apprenticeships or use it to gain some life experience.

General Application advice (jobs or apprenticeships):

- Read the job description.
- Make sure that you have evidenced that you have all the skills/attributes and experience required in the job description.
- Research the company and include evidence of this in your application!
- Don't forget the basics spelling, grammar and punctuation!
- Don't just apply to one place; you are going to need to apply to lots of employers!
