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Our students' academic achievements are only part of the picture. At Huntington School, our Sixth Formers are encouraged to develop a confident and outward-looking approach to life through a wide range of extra-curricular activities and extensive pastoral support.

PASTORAL SUPPORT

On entering the Sixth Form, each student is assigned a Form Tutor, who is responsible for the pastoral well-being of each student in their care. Students see their Form Tutor at least once a day and will have a formal interview with them at least every four weeks. In addition, the Head of Year, the Attendance Manager and Director of Sixth Form are available to discuss issues with parents and students.

THE PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Every Wednesday afternoon our students are given the opportunity to develop their skills and talents outside the classroom through a range of extra-curricular activities.

LEVEL 3 CERTIFICATES AND DIPLOMAS

We offer Level 3 Certificates and Diplomas in a range of subjects. Each Level 3 Certificate is equivalent to one A-level and each Level 3 Diploma is equivalent to two A-levels. They have significantly more coursework than A-levels and fewer exams. Each subject is awarded on a Pass, Merit, Distinction and Distinction Plus basis and are accepted by both universities and employers.


It pays to keep learning

Whichever route you choose, it pays to keep learning. More and more, employers are looking for people with higher level skills and qualifications.


Although qualifications cannot guarantee you a job, people with the right skills and qualifications have a better chance of finding a job with good prospects and more money. They may also have more job security.


