They process all notifications of absence and ensures that our registers are kept up to date and accurate, which is an important part of our safeguarding processes. They also process the administration of requests for leave of absence, and other such paperwork.

MOBILE PHONES IN SCHOOL

We would like to remind parents and carers that students are not permitted to use their mobile phones when in school.

We understand that students need this technology when leaving or on the way to school but have clear expectations that they will be switched off and put away in their bags during the school day. If a mobile phone is visible in school, our policy is that it will be confiscated and handed into student reception.

We would therefore appreciate your support and request that any communication to your child during the school day, such as to request forgotten equipment or notifying you of illness, is done via a member of the pastoral team. We always encourage our students to seek out their year team in order to resolve such issues. Contact details for each year team can also be found at the end of this letter.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

At Huntington School we feel that all our students benefit from the fact that we have a sixth form. Our sixth form students are positive role models and are a daily source of inspiration to younger students. Many of them engage in activities in school that involve supporting and leading others, these including in-form support, paired reading, and supporting with extra-curricular clubs.

Over the past few weeks, we have been delivering training to all of our sixth formers as we set up the 'Student Leadership Accreditation', which we are going to support them all to achieve. This is a way of recognising their leadership skills and the impact they have in the classroom, across the school, and in the wider community. Students will assess themselves against a framework and they will be supported to actively seek opportunities to advance themselves and gather evidence to showcase their new skills in a portfolio. A Teams page has been created with support resources and students can work towards the accreditation at three levels: bronze, silver and gold.

The award will provide the students with valuable evidence of their all-round achievements when applying for colleges, universities, or jobs. Additionally, many of the skills students use in the process will reinforce key learning competencies.

We are so proud of how engaged the students have been so far with the training. We look forward to seeing how it progresses and watching our sixth formers inspire the younger students to see what is possible and help them to be aspirational and ambitious.



SPARX CONGRATULATIONS

Congratulations to everyone for making a great start on Sparx Maths this year. Nearly 2000 schools in the UK use Sparx as a weekly homework platform and Huntington is in the top 20% for completion rate.
